It has already been a very busy couple of weeks for GBM to kick off Term 3. We had our annual WAYJO (WA Youth Jazz Orchestra) incursion on Wednesday 3rd August. Students in the Jazz and Senior Bands were treated to an hour of jazz from these excellent musicians.

Jazz Band 1 were lucky enough to get to perform some of their pieces with WAYJO so hopefully in years to come, we may see a few GBM alumni included in this group.

At the end of Week 3, the Senior Band went off to Perth to once again perform at the ABODA Schools' Senior Band Festival. The students were also able to attend a Jazz Concert Practice session at WAAPA where we caught up with one of our year 12s from 2021. It was good to see the WAAPA students giving each other constructive feedback as they identified positives and possible improvements in the performance of the group that played. This is something that we have been trying to develop in our senior ensemble rehearsals so it was good to see it in action.

The Senior Band did a brilliant job at the Band Festival, and received some excellent feedback on their work from the adjudicator. I am very excited to say that we were awarded the highest rating of "OUTSTANDING" in A Division. which is an apt award for the tremendous work that ALL students did in the lead up to the festival (including those that didn't attend camp). The band also participated in a workshop that was led by the adjudicator who took them through one of the pieces to talk about phrasing and voicing. This had also been discussed during rehearsals so it was great to have it backed up as the focus of the workshop.

The trip was finished with a trip to Crown to see the show "Eireborn", which was a show to celebrate the dance and music of Ireland. It was a fantastic opportunity for the students to see and hear another style of music in a venue that many have never been to before.

Overall, the Senior Band Festival tour was a fantastic experience for both students and staff. Thanks again to Kerry for her help in the organisation of the tour, and to James Kiely and Fiona Lemon for their invaluable assistance in creating such a successful event.

We now look forward to the Junior Band Festival in which our Intermediate Band will perform. Last year's camp for this group was very successful and it will be great to see these students in action.
