Term 3 is a very busy term for Music festivals, Music camps and workshops. All the GBM students have been working very hard in their bands this term to prepare for performances coming up in Term 4, and in their instrumental lessons for end of term assessments. All our Intermediate Band and Senior Band members have been working solidly to prepare for their Music camps in Perth to play in the ABODA Schools' band festival.

So far this term we have already had the Senior Band festival Camp. We all had a great time in Perth at the newly refurbished Ern Halliday Camp school. The students rehearsed really well at the camp school, spending around 5 hours preparing the Music for the band festival performance, and getting a head start on the music for the graduation ceremony next term. We also had some time for late night shopping on Thursday night, some team building fun at Lazer Tag, and also a trip to see the West Australian Symphony Orchestra on Friday evening. The students were treated to an amazing international soloist playing the Tchaikovsky Violin concerto.

We have recently received the adjudicator's report and the whole band is to be congratulated on their amazing result of 'Outstanding', the highest award in the festival. Thank you for all the hard work that Mr Parkinson has done to prepare and conduct the band for their outstanding performance at the band festival this term, and for his ongoing work preparing and mentoring these students for the big performances coming up next term. Thanks also go to Miss Lemon for giving up her time helping out at extra rehearsals, at the camp and at the performance on the day. The percussion section sounded absolutely amazing at the event and received a special mention from the adjudicator in the report. Well done Music team and students!

Coming up, we have the Junior band festival camp in week 8, which involves our Intermediate band members. We will be playing at the ABODA schools' band festival on Saturday the 9th September, and the camp will be running from Friday to Sunday. During the camp we will participate in a big regional workshop with schools from Bunbury, Geraldton, Donnybrook and Collie, as well as have the opportunity to see the Mary Poppins show in Perth on the Saturday night. It should be a fun filled camp with a lot of musical opportunities.

Also coming up this term is our primary instrumental workshop in Week 9. This is our big event for our primary school instrumental students to come together and play in a large band setting, some of them for the first time ever. They will receive help and mentoring from the Senior Band students to learn their music during the day, and the whole event will culminate in a short performance for parents and friends at 2:30pm.

Next term, the senior ensembles will be involved in both the Busselton SHS and Cape Naturaliste College graduation ceremonies, and the senior concert in week 3. Stay tuned for more information coming out about these events later this term.
