What a busy term it has been! We have had a multitude of events this term enabling the students to participate in a whole variety of musical experiences in different settings. We kicked off the Term with the BSHS Presentation Evening on the 19th October. For this big event, Senior band and Jazz Band I provided the Musical entertainment, with Jazz I providing the pre-show entertainment as the guests arrived. Lexi Windsor sang the national anthem with full concert band backing, and the senior band provided the music for the dignitaries walk in and out, and the piece in the ceremony.

We were also able to participate this year in the CNC Graduation at the Bunbury Regional Entertainment Centre on Monday 23rd October. It has been a while since we played at a CNC graduation so it was great to have Music department represented there. This involved a bus trip to Bunbury with Jazz Band I, where they provided pre-show entertainment, and we had a small group of students on stage playing the national anthem, with Scarlett Scerri singing. Thanks to the Music Support group for providing us with funds for dinner, and to CNC for providing funds for the bus hire. These Graduation ceremonies are important and high profile events in the Busselton community, and the students did a great job representing the Music department, as well as their prospective schools.

Our next event for the Term was the Senior Concert. This concert is a showcase of our senior ensembles and soloists, and it is also an important farewell concert for our Year 12 students. These students have been with us in the IMSS program for 8 years. It is a big achievement to commit to the music program for that length of time and the students graduating this year were Lexi Windsor, Tholane Jonas and Jessie Russell. The senior band and Jazz Band I were also showcased in this concert, and did an amazing job entertaining our audience – it was absolutely packed!

To round off the Term, we had our final concert for the year, our Sundowner concert on the 23rd November. This showcased the junior and intermediate ensembles from the GBM program. Jazz Band II, Contemporary Ensemble, Classical Guitar Ensemble, Junior Band and Intermediate band all played a set. We also had a guest appearance from Jazz I, and a final combined item with Jazz I and Jazz II to finish off the evening: "Lets Get Loud!" with Scarlett on Vocals.

It was great to meet some of the new students and parents coming into the program at our Parent Information Evening on the 29th November. The Senior Band held an open rehearsal for the group so they could hear the different instruments in action. There have also been a number of end of year assemblies at our local primary schools for our primary instrumental students to perform in front of their peers at their own school, and these have been a great success.

It has been a great semester of Music making, and to be in the 'big chair' while Brad has been away has been a privilege. We have a great group of students in GBM, and they show a lot of dedication and commitment to the bands and Music program. We also have amazing staff working at GBM, and I can't thank them enough for their hard work and dedication – after hours set up, concerts, meetings, excursions, camps as well as all the teaching that they do during the day is invaluable, and this department would not run without the hard work of all the staff involved. Our IMSS staff - David Parkinson, Fiona Lemon, James Kiely, Stacey Smart, as well as our classroom colleagues Aidan Walsh and Sian Fenn all contribute to the smooth running of the department. Thanks also go to Kerry La Motte, for her hours of paperwork, emails and phone calls to ensure the smooth running of the program. We also have a group of dedicated parents in our Music Support Group chaired by Coralie Wind, that help us with our events providing catering and raffles. We could not provide all these musical experiences without their generous contribution of their time and effort. All in all it is a huge team effort. And lastly, I would like to thank the administration at both schools for their support – BSHS led by Mr Rob Nail and CNC led by Ms Melanie Ryan. Their support of the Music program is immense.

I will finish by signing off for the year and welcoming back Brad Oversby for the start of 2024 who will take up the reins of GBM again, and lead it forward onto greater things!

BSHS PRESENTATION EVENING

Our first performance for Term 4 2023 was the Busselton SHS Presentation evening. This is a big event congratulating and farewelling all the Year 12 students after their final year of schooling. The GBM Senior band and Jazz I were the musical entertainment for the evening, with Jazz I providing the pre-show entertainment. The Jazz band played really well with such favourites as Car Wash and Birdland. The performance went down a treat with the audience, especially with Scarlett Scerri joining us to sing a couple of numbers – Faith and I'm still standing.

The Senior Band took centre stage for this performance, playing the walk-in music for the dignitaries and Year 12s. Quad City stomp worked perfectly for this purpose. The Senior Band then performed 'Best of the West' complete with cowboy hats and completed the walk out music at the end of the night.
